Although Holloman was in the middle of nowhere, Carol came under the wing of the colonel's wife who introduced her to the life of a military officer's wife. Their involvement with Crosspoint began many years ago when they were stationed at Eglin. Carol was a member of the Becomer's Circle. You may not know that this group hosted the very first craft show at Crosspoint, an event that would continue for decades. The group also made baskets and delivered them to homebound folks.

Carol also volunteered at that time at Plew, teaching an art lesson each month in her daughter's class. While the students went to recess she created beautiful bulletin boards incorporating the children's art work.

Gaither Vocal Band Concert


