Week 1

Brite Idea: Jesus knows us.

He Question: What does Jesus know about people?

Week 2

Week 3

Brite Idea: Jesus knows our fears

Week 4

Brite Idea: Jesus wants us to know Him.

He Question: What does it mean that Jesus is the Christ?

Christ means "Messiah" or "Anointed One." All through the Old Testament, God had promised to send a Rescuer to save the people from their sins. Jesus is that Rescuer—the Christ.

We Question: What does it mean to have a relationship with Jesus?
